Note; Whereas in the foregoing Lift, some Towns, &c. are frid to be the King's, and others extressly faid to be other Persons; but the greater Number mention neither: We are to zenderstand that all such Towns, as were the Antient Demeasus of the Crown, svere named Villa Rogis, and such as swere the Demeasns of other Lords were named accordingly, but all the antient Burrows of the Kingdom being free could not properly be said to be the Burrs of the King or any other Lord: For as all Villae or Towns were either the King's or some other Lords Demeasns, so their Inhabitants were generally Villani or Villeins, to do and pay at their Lords Pleasure, and therefore could not chuse their own Magistrates, nor be retresented in Parliament. On the contrary, the Burrows of the Kingdom originally imported Freedom; they were all Liberi Burgi, and their Inhabitants Liberi Bargenses. But when King John and other Princes. on valuable Considerations, erected such Vills or Towns into Burrows, the the Inhabitants thereby purchased their Freedom, yet the Stile of his or our Town was thence Transferr'd to that of his or our Burrow.
